Minutes of the March 28, 2018 Board of Supervisors Meeting Central County Water Control District

- 1. Call to Order. Meeting called to order at 7:00p.m.
- 2. Roll Call. a. The Chair called the roll. Supervisors Napoles, Faraldo, Naranjo, and Miller were present, and joined by the District Attorney, District Engineer, and District Treasurer.
 - b. Pledge of Allegiance. Chair lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Approval of Meeting Agenda

- a. Additions, Deletion, and Substitutions. None.
- **b. Adoption of Agenda.** Approval of February 21, 2018 Workshop Agenda and Regular Meeting Agenda of February 28. 2018.
- c. Approval of Minutes. Approval of Workshop Minutes of February 21, 2018 and Regular Meeting Minutes of February 28, 2018.
- 4. Public Comments. James Garrett spoke about problems dealing with the Reservoir, such as keys, non-residents having access, etc.

Deputy AJ Maynard expressed his observations from the last time he was at the reservoir.

Staff Reports

a. Acting Manager's Report.

Reported on the roads that were fixed, culverts done, keys sold, and other pertinent activities for the month. Included repair of machinery and equipment.

b. Clubhouse Manager's Report

Reported on the Clubhouse building and surrounding areas. Activities vacation time paid instead of losing it because he had to work as Acting Manager. Board voted and approved paying his vacation time.

c. Engineer's Report.

Mr. Bennett discussed canals in the Woodland area. Supervisor asked him to bring solutions for that area for the next meeting.

d. Accountant's Report

Mr. Boy gave a review of the District's economy for the month. The Acting Manager went over how much money was saved this month. Stated that the savings was a result of Central County being able to accomplish the assignments that the lawyer recommended we take on in order to lower the cost of his services. Money was also saved with the insurance company by updating the employees' status. Supervisor Napoles discussed why we should transfer money to another bank that offers better interest.

e. Attorney's Report

Mr. Fumero stated that he had finalized the contract with the Schultzer group. Had also made an agreement with the sheriff's office dealing with the reservoir and the clubhouse. He sent letters from Ms. Hester's lawyer to all supervisors. The letter stated that she was suing CC. The lawyer also spoke about insurance coverage for liability for the Board members. Supervisors voted all in favor for the coverage. Motion passed. Lawyer discussed Crist Self's incident where he was assaulted by an employee at CC parking lot. He is planning to contact him to make him an offer of paying his medical bill. Supervisor Napoles asked the lawyer to offer his apology for what took place. The lawyer and supervisors discussed the salary and benefits for the new manager. The Board voted on approving the contract as follows; Yea- Napoles, Miller, Naranjo. Nea-Faraldo. Motion passed.

Monthly report

April 2018

April 2; put out 9 loads of shell rock on Kennel, grade material and rolled material, this was only patching holes. Estimated material used was 45 cubic yards.

Cleaned the ends of culverts from Arboleda to Olivo. Approximately 11 roads.

April 3; Continued on Kennel, put out another 9 loads of shell rock, graded and rolled. Estimated 45 cubic yards of material.

Mowed the side of the road on Pine Cone, Live Oak and Jinete. Boomed mowed on Verda Street.

April 4; Once again worked on Kennel put out 11 loads of material or approximately 55 cubic yards, patching holes, graded and rolled.

Continued mowing Jinete and mowed Arboleda.

Worked on cleaning and repairing signs, approximately 7 signs were repaired or cleaned.

April 4; Put out 2 loads of material in holes on Kennel, approximately 10cubic yards,, graded and rolled, grader came back to shop for tire repair.

Went and put riser boards back in riser at pump 9, 10, someone pulled approximately 4 boards, 2 out of each side.

Cleaned up around dumpsters, debris on ground all around dumpsters.

Mowed side of roads at, Deer, Elk, Bald Cypress, Riverside, Live Oak, Palm, Willow and Jasmine.

Picked up trash and worked on signs on Cabbage Palm.

April 9; Continued on Kennel, put out 11 loads of shell rock, graded and rolled. Estimated 55 cubic yards of material, in holes on street.

Mowed Riverside, cleaned bathrooms and picked up parts from town.

Boomed mowed on Pine cone and cleaned end of culverts, tires went out on excavator and had to be repaired.

Cleaned signs on Del Club and Cabbage Palm and fixed sign lights on Montura entrance.

April 10; Fixed holes in Hacienda, repaired signs on Cabbage Palm and Bald Cypress.; Continued on Kennel, put out 6 loads of shell rock, graded and rolled. Estimated 30 cubic yards of material, in holes on street.

Changed blades on boom mower then mowed Del-Centro.

April 11; Boom mowed from Arboleda to Foronda.

Mowed side of road on Cabbage Palm.

Graded and rolled from Perimeter to Del Sur.

Fixed 15 holes in Hacienda.

April 12; Repaired 16 holes on Palm Street. Started mowing Hunting Club. Inspected culverts, 20 culverts was inspected with 9 passing inspection, rest waiting on culvert installation.

April 13; Ordered an additional 20 loads of road base material to continue on road repairs.

Contacted Kelly tractor, they charge for Zone 5 service charge instead of zone 1, a difference of \$500.00 in charges.

Reviewed resumes for Executive Assistant, started grading applications for position, selection should be made before the end of Month.

- 3) The Commissioner of Education, members of the State Board of Education, the Board of Governors, the local Boards of Trustees and Presidents of state universities, and the Florida Prepaid College Board.
- 4) Persons elected to office in any political subdivision (such as municipalities, counties, and special districts) and any person appointed to fill a vacancy in such office, unless required to file Form 6.

PUBLIC RECORD: The disclosure form and everything attached to it is a public record. Your Social Security Number is not required and you should redact it from any documents you file. If you are an active or former officer or employee listed in Section 119.071, F.S., whose home address is exempt from disclosure, the Commission will maintain that confidentiality if you submit a written request.

PART B — SECONDARY SOURCES OF INCOME

- You are a 20% partner in a partnership that owns a shopping mall and your partnership income exceeded the above thresholds. List each tenant of the mall that provided more than 10% of the partnership's gross income and the tenant's address and principal business activity.

PART C - REAL PROPERTY

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(b)3, F.S.]

In this part, list the location or description of all real property in Florida in which you owned directly or indirectly at any time during the disclosure period in excess of 5% of the property's value. You are not required to list your residences. You should list any vacation homes if you derive income from them.

Indirect ownership includes situations where you are a beneficiary of a trust that owns the property, as well as situations where you own more than 5% of a partnership or corporation that owns the property. The value of the property may be determined by the most recently assessed value for tax purposes, in the absence of a more current appraisal.

The location or description of the property should be sufficient to enable anyone who looks at the form to identify the property. A street address should be used, if one exists.

PART D — INTANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(b)3, F.S.]

Describe any intangible personal property that, at any time during the disclosure period, was worth more than \$10,000 and state the business entity to which the property related. List the name and address of each creditor to whom you owed more than \$10,000 at any time during the disclosure period. The amount of the liability of a vehicle lease is the sum of any past-due payments and all unpaid prospective lease payments. You are not required to list the amount of any debt. You do not have to disclose credit card and retail installment accounts, taxes owed (unless reduced to a judgment), indebtedness on a life insurance policy owed to the company of issuance, or contingent liabilities. A "contingent liability" is one that will become an actual liability only when one or more future events occur or fail to occur, such as where you are liable only as a guarantor, surety, or endorser on a promissory note. If you are a "co-maker" and are jointly liable or jointly and severally liable, then it is not a contingent liability.

"Gross income" means the same as it does for income tax purposes, even if the income is not actually taxable, such as interest on tax-free bonds. Examples include: compensation for services, income from business, gains from property dealings, interest, rents, dividends, pensions, IRA distributions, social security, distributive share of partnership gross income, and alimony, but not child support.

Examples:

- If you were employed by a company that manufactures computers and received more than 5% of your gross income from the company, list the name of the company, its address, and its principal business activity (computer manufacturing).
- If you were a partner in a law firm and your distributive share of partnership gross income exceeded 5% of your gross income, then list the name of the firm, its address, and its principal business activity (practice of law).
- If you were the sole proprietor of a retail gift business and your gross income from the business exceeded 5% of your total gross income, list the name of the business, its address, and its principal business activity (retail gift sales).
- If you received income from investments in stocks and bonds, list <u>each individual company</u> from which you derived

more than 5% of your gross income. Do not aggregate all of your investment income.

- If more than 5% of your gross income was gain from the sale of property (not just the selling price), list as a source of income the purchaser's name, address, and principal business activity. If the purchaser's identity is unknown, such as where securities listed on an exchange are sold through a brokerage firm, the source of income should be listed as "sale of (name of company) stock," for example.
- If more than 5% of your gross income was in the form of interest from one particular financial institution (aggregating interest from all CD's, accounts, etc., at that institution), list the name of the institution, its address, and its principal business activity.

PART B — SECONDARY SOURCES OF INCOME

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(a)2, F.S.]

This part is intended to require the disclosure of major customers, clients, and other sources of income to businesses in which you own an interest. It is not for reporting income from second jobs. That kind of income should be reported in Part A, "Primary Sources of Income," if it meets the reporting threshold. You will **not** have anything to report **unless** during the disclosure period:

- (1) You owned (either directly or indirectly in the form of an equitable or beneficial interest) more than 5% of the total assets or capital stock of a business entity (a corporation, partnership, LLC, limited partnership, proprietorship, joint venture, trust, firm, etc., doing business in Florida); and,
- (2) You received more than 10% of your gross income from that business entity; and,
- (3) You received more than \$1,500 in gross income from that business entity.

If your interests and gross income exceeded these thresholds, then for that business entity you must list every source of income to the business entity which exceeded 10% of the business entity's gross income (computed on the basis of the business entity's most recently completed fiscal year), the source's address, and the source's principal business activity.

Examples:

— You are the sole proprietor of a dry cleaning business, from which you received more than 10% of your gross income—an amount that was more than \$1,500. If only one customer, a uniform rental company, provided more than 10% of your dry cleaning business, you must list the name of the uniform rental company, its address, and its principal business activity (uniform rentals).

— You are a 20% partner in a partnership that owns a shopping mall and your partnership income exceeded the thresholds listed above. You should list each tenant of the mall that provided more than 10% of the partnership's gross income, and the tenant's address and principal business activity.

PART C — REAL PROPERTY

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(a)3, F.S.]

In this part, list the location or description of all real property in Florida in which you owned directly or indirectly at any time during the disclosure period in excess of 5% of the property's value. You are not required to list your residences. You should list any vacation homes, if you derive income from them.

Indirect ownership includes situations where you are a beneficiary of a trust that owns the property, as well as situations where you own more than 5% of a partnership or corporation that owns the property. The value of the property may be determined by the most recently assessed value for tax purposes, in the absence of a more current appraisal.

The location or description of the property should be sufficient to enable anyone who looks at the form to identify the property. A street address should be used, if one exists.

PART D — INTANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(a)3, F.S.]

Describe any intangible personal property that, at any time during the disclosure period, was worth more than 10% of your total assets, and state the business entity to which the property related. Intangible personal property includes things such as cash on hand, stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit, vehicle leases, interests in businesses, beneficial interests in trusts, money owed you, Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP) accounts, the Florida Prepaid College Plan, and bank accounts. Intangible personal property also includes investment products held in IRAs, brokerage accounts, and the Florida College Investment Plan. Note that the product contained in a brokerage account, IRA, or the Florida College Investment Plan is your asset—not the account or plan itself. Things like automobiles and houses you own, jewelry, and paintings are not intangible property. Intangibles relating to the same business entity may be aggregated; for example, CD's and savings accounts with the same bank.

Calculations: To determine whether the intangible property exceeds 10% of your total assets, total the fair market value of all of your assets (including real property, intangible property, and tangible personal property such as jewelry, furniture, etc.). When making this calculation, do not subtract any liabilities (debts) that may relate to the property. Multiply the total figure by 10% to arrive at the disclosure threshold. List only the intangibles that exceed this threshold amount. The value of a leased vehicle is the vehicle's present value minus the lease residual (a number which can be found on the lease document). Property that is only jointly owned property should be valued according to the percentage of your joint ownership. Property owned as tenants by the entirety or as joint tenants with right of survivorship should be valued at 100%. None of your calculations or the value of the property have to be disclosed on the form.

Example: You own 50% of the stock of a small corporation that is worth \$100,000, the estimated fair market value of your home and other property (bank accounts, automobile, furniture, etc.) is \$200,000. As your total assets are worth \$250,000, you must disclose intangibles worth over \$25,000. Since the value of the stock exceeds this threshold, you should list "stock" and the name of the corporation. If your accounts with a particular bank exceed \$25,000, you should list "bank accounts" and bank's name.

PART E - LIABILITIES

[Required by s. 112.3145(3)(b)4, F.S.]

List the name and address of each creditor to whom you owed any amount that, at any time during the disclosure period, exceeded your net worth. You are not required to list the amount of any debt or your net worth. You do not have to disclose: credit card and retail installment accounts, taxes owed (unless reduced to a judgment), indebtedness on a life insurance policy owed to the company of issuance, or contingent liabilities. A "contingent liability" is one that will become an actual liability only when one or more future events occur or fail to occur, such as where you are liable only as a guarantor, surety, or endorser on a promissory note. If you are a "co-maker" and are jointly liable or jointly and severally liable, it is not a contingent liability.

Calculations: To determine whether the debt exceeds your net worth, total all of your liabilities (including promissory notes, mortgages, credit card debts, judgments against you, etc.). The amount of the liability of a vehicle lease is the sum of any past-due payments and all unpaid prospective lease payments. Subtract the sum total of your liabilities from the value of all your assets as calculated above for Part D. This is your "net worth." List each creditor to whom your debt exceeded this amount unless it is one of the types of indebtedness listed in the paragraph above (credit card and retail installment accounts, etc.). Joint liabilities with others for which you are "jointly and severally liable," meaning that you may be liable for either your part or the whole of the obligation, should be included in your calculations at 100% of the amount owed.

Example: You owe \$15,000 to a bank for student loans, \$5,000 for credit card debts, and \$60,000 (with spouse) to a savings and loan for a home mortgage. Your home (owned by you and your spouse) is worth \$80,000 and your other property is worth \$20,000. Since your net worth is \$20,000 (\$100,000 minus \$80,000), you must report only the name and address of the savings and loan.

PART F — INTERESTS IN SPECIFIED BUSINESSES

[Required by s. 112.3145, F.S.]

The types of businesses covered in this disclosure include: state and federally chartered banks; state and federal savings and loan associations; cemetery companies; insurance companies; mortgage companies; credit unions; small loan companies; alcoholic beverage licensees; pari-mutuel wagering companies, utility companies, entities controlled by the Public Service Commission; and entities granted a franchise to operate by either a city or a county government.

Disclose in this part the fact that you owned during the disclosure period an interest in, or held any of certain positions with, the types of businesses listed above. You are required to make this disclosure if you own or owned (either directly or indirectly in the form of an equitable or beneficial interest) at any time during the disclosure period more than 5% of the total assets or capital stock of one of the types of business entities listed above. You also must complete this part of the form for each of these types of businesses for which you are, or were at any time during the disclosure period, an officer, director, partner, proprietor, or agent (other than a resident agent solely for service of process).

If you have or held such a position or ownership interest in one of these types of businesses, list the name of the business, its address and principal business activity, and the position held with the business (if any). If you own(ed) more than a 5% interest in the business, indicate that fact and describe the nature of your interest.

PART G - TRAINING CERTIFICATION

[Required by s. 112.3142, F.S.]

If you are a Constitutional or elected municipal officer whose service began before March 31 of the year for which you are filing, you are required to complete four hours of ethics training which addresses Article II, Section 8 of the Florida Constitution, the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, and the public records and open meetings laws of the state. You are required to certify on this form that you have taken such training.
