

RESOLUTION 18-11A

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CENTRAL COUNTY WATER CONTROL DISTRICT LEVYING INSTALLMENT AND MAINTENANCE TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2019; AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT TREASURER TO CERTIFY THE ASSESSMENT OF INSTALLMENT AND MAINTENANCE TAXES TO THE HENDRY COUNTY TAX COLLECTOR; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Central County Water Control District (the "District") is a Florida water control district; and

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2018, the District's Board of Supervisors (the "Board") approved a Final Budget for the fiscal year ending on September 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 298.36, Florida Statutes, the District's Board of Supervisors (the "Board") is authorized to levy installment and maintenance taxes upon each parcel of land in the District; and

WHEREAS, in order to meet the financial obligations associated with the Final Budget, the District's Water Control Plan, and the District's statutory purposes, the District Board desires to levy installment and maintenance taxes upon each parcel of land in the District.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the Central County Water Control District as follows:

Section 1. The levy of a maintenance tax in the amount of \$196.35 and installment tax (capital improvement debt service) in the amount of \$23.65 is hereby certified upon each parcel of land in the District for the upcoming fiscal year.

Section 2. The District Treasurer is authorized to provide evidence of this levy and certification to the tax assessor and property appraiser of Hendry County, and any other persons

and government entities in furtherance of the District's annual levy of installment and maintenance taxes.

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
